THE WORK: Henry Purcell (1659-1695) was the first English composer to write multiple works for the trumpet. His orchestral writings are filled with interesting trumpet parts but no work is more famous to trumpeters than this Sonata. Originally for trumpet and strings, this piece displays the Bologna influence heightened by Purcell's own more bold harmonic clashes. The manuscript was discovered in 1950 and has been one of the most frequently performed and recorded pieces in the trumpet repertoire. There is much interplay between the soloist and the rest of the ensemble and this antiphonal performance practice is quite characteristic of the period.

THE TRANSCRIPTION: The solo trumpet part falls to the first trumpet and the remainder of the ensemble performs the orchestral parts. A great deal of antiphonal writing has been done and the two choirs can be used to produce echo effects. All dynamics, articulations and ornaments are suggestions by the arranger and the performer should feel free to alter these musical nuances at their discretion. The continuo part is essential and can be performed by a trombone (euphonium), or a bassoon. The continuo part has been placed in three different keys to allow the performers to select whichever instruments they wish. High school level trumpet ensembles might want to use the parts in Bb while a professional group might want to use the parts in C or the original D.

The arranger suggests that in the second movement, the trumpets be muted with either straight or cup mutes. This colour change makes the overall effect of the piece more interesting. The third movement should be played with mutes removed.
